

- A key priority of the Vancouver School District is to ensure all students attend seismically safe schools as quickly as possible to protect our students and staff from harm in an event of an earthquake.
- As part of the Province's Seismic Mitigation Program, the Ministry of Education is investing \$29.06 million, the Vancouver School Board is providing \$1.06 million and the City of Vancouver is contributing \$10 million for a proposed rooftop child care centre.
- The District will build a new school on the existing field at Hudson Elementary. After the new school is built, existing buildings will be demolished and replaced with a new playfield.
- Students will continue to attend school in the existing buildings during construction. Therefore, no temporary accommodation is required.
- Construction is scheduled to begin in spring 2022 and finish in summer 2024.
- The District will meet with representatives from the school community to provide updates on the replacement school.

Key features of the replacement school include:

- ✓ The new school will be designed to have the same number of classrooms as the existing school.
- ✓ The new school will have flexible learning spaces and Neighbourhood Learning Centre space for community and school use.
- ✓ The new school will be environmentally friendly and built to LEED® Gold Standards.
- ✓ The existing preschool spaces and out-of-school care spaces will remain available throughout construction and will be included in the new school.
- ✓ The City of Vancouver is funding a proposed 69-space childcare facility for ages 0-4 on the rooftop.
