FACT SHEET

- A key priority of the Vancouver School District is to ensure all students attend seismically safe schools as quickly as possible in order to protect our students and staff from harm in an event of an earthquake.
- As part of the province's Seismic Mitigation Program, the Ministry of Education allocated \$24.2 million to fully replace David Lloyd George (DLG) Elementary School.
- A feasibility study determined that replacing the school was the most cost effective and least disruptive option. A public information session about the feasibility study was held in February 2018.
- The District has regularly met with the school community to gather input to design a replacement school that meets the educational needs of the students.
- Key features of the replacement school include:
 - A new, two-level seismically safe school.
 - 21st Century learning design where the rooms are built to create flexible spaces that allow for both formal and informal learning opportunities.
 - An environmentally friendly facility built to Leadership in Energy and Environment Design (LEED) Gold standards.
 - Break-out rooms with natural light being shared by two classrooms.
 - A library as a focal point for interaction.
 - A kitchen near the multi-purpose room.
 - Spare Time Fun Centre, the existing out of school care will remain on site.
 - A 69-space childcare for children ages 0 – 4, funded by the City of Vancouver. The daycare space will be over and above the area already allocated for the school.
- After the replacement school is built, the existing DLG school will be used as a temporary accommodation to allow other school seismic projects to proceed.
