All parents, guardians, and/or caregivers have the responsibility to conduct a Daily Health Assessment of the student each day before sending them to school. This is a one-time form; a copy does not need to be submitted to your school each day.

WHAT TO DO NEXT

If you answered "No" to all of the above (1-4), the student is welcome to attend school.

1. If you answered "Yes" to any of the above symptoms, follow the instructions below:

SYMPTOMS		WHAT TO DO
Fever (above 38°C) Chills Cough	Loss of sense of smell or taste Difficulty breathing	1 or more of these symptoms: Get tested and stay home.
Sore throat Loss of appetite Headache Body aches	Extreme fatigue or tiredness Nausea or vomiting Diarrhea	If you have 1 symptom: Stay home until you feel better. If you have 2 or more of these symptoms: Stay home and wait 24 hours to see if you feel better. Get tested if not better after 24 hours.

3. If you answered "Yes" to any of the above symptoms, follow the instructions below:

Masks

Students are asked to provide their own masks.

Masks are to be worn over the nose and mouth.



Masks must be always worn when in the school



Staff must wear masks except when eating or working alone.



Student must wear masks except when drinking or eating

Cleaning High Touch surfaces

The directions below are from the Communicable Disease
Prevention Plan 2021 2022



- Staff who use or introduce shared equipment or, in secondary schools or adult education, the students who use the equipment, will clean and disinfect:
 - Items such as shared computer keyboards and tablets, dishes and kitchen equipment, PE/sports equipment, music equipment, etc.
 - Appliances which are shared such as microwaves, refrigerators, coffee pots/machines, etc.
 - Equipment that touches the mouth (e.g., water bottles, instrument mouth pieces, dishes, certain toys, and manipulatives) or that have been in contact with body fluids should not be shared unless cleaned and disinfected in between use by others.
