**Principal's Message**

Dear Families,

As we move quickly to the end of June and the school year, our grade 7's are counting their remaining days at Hudson while eagerly looking forward to their start of secondary school. The grade 7 Leaving Ceremony is on the afternoon of June 26. Grade 7 families have received their invitations. As the grade 7's close out the elementary school portion of their education journey, next year's Kindergarten class began their journey with last week's successful Welcome to Kindergarten afternoon. Almost 90% of next year's Kindergarten class attended.

During the past few days there have been various individuals from Planning and Facilities, surveyors and project planners on site preparing for both the placement of a portable and seismic upgrade planning projects. As well, VSB trades have been onsite repairing broken windows, re-tiling in student bathrooms and repairing toilets. With a school as old as Hudson, there is never a shortage of upgrades that need attention. Other work orders have also been submitted for work to be completed over the summer break.

In the last newsletter, I had mentioned the ongoing safety concern of the parking and student drop off situation on York Street. I am pleased to report that although it is still problematic there has been a reduction in the number of vehicles at key drop off and pick up times. With continued efforts I am hopeful that a further reduction of vehicles will occur.

June is typically a month that has an increased number of field trips. Teachers plan the trips in accordance with the Vancouver School Board's field trip guidelines. The field trips are then approved by the Principal and District approval is sought when the field trips involve over- night stays. The district guidelines include supervision ratios and classify field trips into various categories related to the nature of the activities. Once a field trip has been approved, it is added to the calendar section of the school website. Parents now have the option of paying for field trips on-line through a link on the school's website

In terms of staffing, the school has one position currently posted and should hopefully be filled prior to the end of June. The school is pleased to welcome Ms. Victoria Lorieau as the new Vice-Principal beginning in September. Ms. Lorieau most recently worked at Lord Tennyson Elementary School.

On May 29, the Hudson PAC provided a staff appreciation luncheon – on behalf of all the staff, I would like thank the PAC for the wonderful luncheon.

In terms of some minor reminders, all library books need to be returned, the comfort kits stored in the earthquake bin will be returned to the students during the last week of June and please take a moment to look through the lost and found – all unclaimed items will be donated to charity. Thank you for your support.
