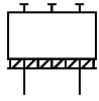
Dear Families,

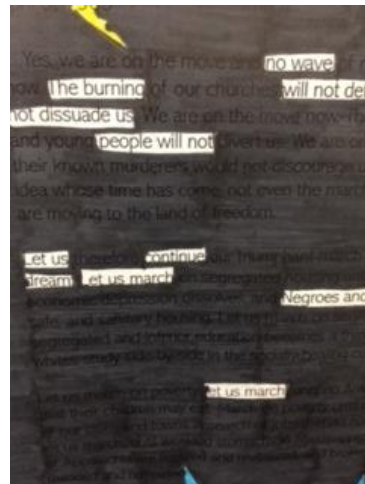
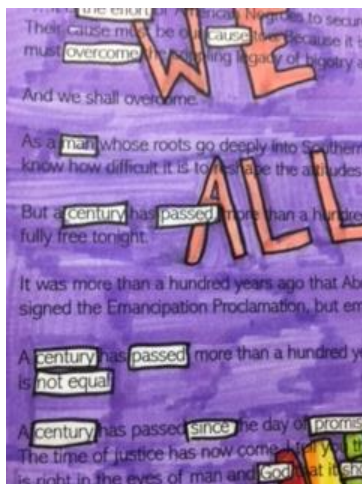
Visible Learning

The students then created Black-out poetry from words they found in these printed speeches. As black-out poets, the students brought out new meaning to the words found in their texts.

They circled words and phrases from the text and then pieced them together to create poetic masterpieces. The randomness of creating a black-out poem was a huge part of the fun and learning!

Our Science World, Bee Bot Bop coding workshop on March 5.



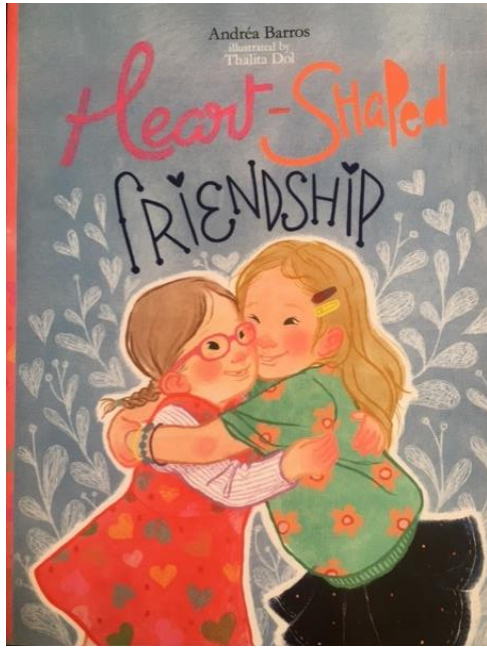

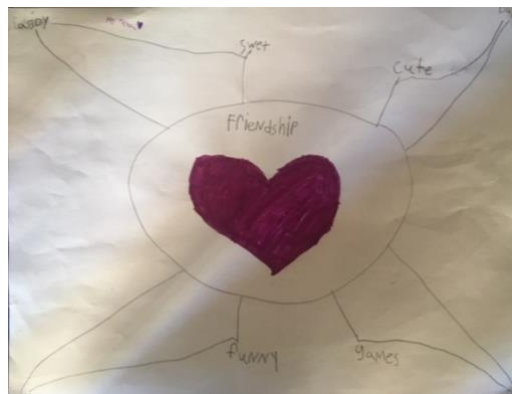
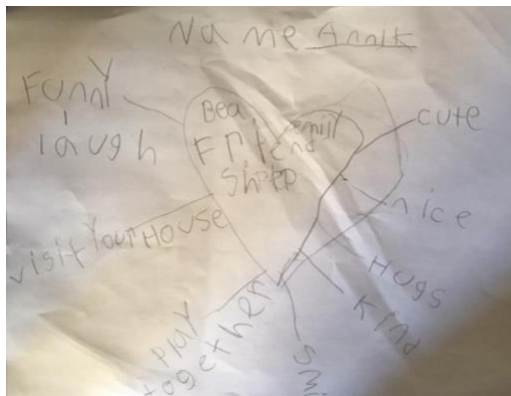
Thank you to Ms. Barros for donating her latest book to the class that is already in book stores.

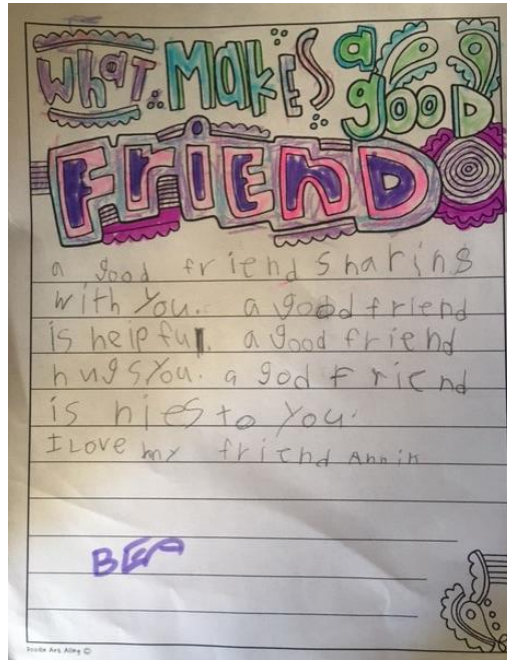
The book has been a great springboard to focus more in depth about friendships.
