Inspire Kids to Care: Plastic Oceans

Our students had an excellent opportunity to view a presentation by Kids to Make a Difference on the topic of Plastic Oceans. The presenters discussed with us effective ways of protecting our oceans by reducing the plastic footprint. We were inspired to begin to take action and protect the living things in our oceans by using reusable items.

Division F15 News: We created **Writing Circles** this week. The authors meet twice a week and share their writing and topic ideas with each other. They decide on a shared topic for the Circle, but each author writes their own text, using different genres and points of view. (Grade 3 students write in French, Grade 4 students write in English).
